
# Joel & Zechariah

## In end-time Prophecy

- The book of **Joel** is positioned between Hosea & Amos (both prophesying at the time of king Uzziah). It is thus most likely Joel was also a pre-exile prophet. The book of Joel does not leave an indication when he lived, but since all other major and minor prophets occur chronologically, it is safe to say the Joel's lived around the time of Hosea & Amos.
- Zechariah prophesied <u>after the exile</u>, and is a contemporary of Zerubbabel (leader) and Haggai (prophet).


### O.T overview: Later Kings up to Judah's return from Exile

## Prophetic 'Day of the Lord' timeline: Colour coded



### Two Basics

- Prophecy often weaves in and out between short-term and future long term fulfilment with no warning.
- Prophecy often has multiple fulfilments. The short-term fulfilment often seems exaggerated, but that is because the long-term fulfilment is often much more dramatic.

## Example 1: Long-term and short-term 'weaving'.

Zech 9:3-8 And **Tyrus** did build herself a strong hold, and heaped up silver as the dust, and fine gold as the mire of the streets. 4 Behold, the Lord will cast her out, and he will smite her power in the sea; and she shall be devoured with fire....8 for now have I seen with mine eyes.

- Tyre was indeed destroyed as prophesied, by the Greek armies.
- But now suddenly, in the next verse, the prophecy <u>shifts to Jesus</u>.

9 Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion; shout, O daughter of Jerusalem: behold, **thy King** cometh unto thee: he **is just,** and **having salvation; lowly,** and **riding upon an ass**, and upon a colt the foal of an ass.

## Example 1 (cont'd): Long-term and short-term 'weaving'.

• The next verse leaps into the *millennium*:

<sup>10</sup> And I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim, and the horse from Jerusalem, and the battle bow shall be cut off: and he shall <u>speak peace unto the heathen</u>: **and his dominion shall be from sea even to sea,** and from the river even to **the ends of the earth**.

• After a single millennial verse, we're back to the short-term, the next empire **Greece**:

13 When I have bent Judah for me, filled the bow with Ephraim, and raised up thy sons, O Zion, against thy sons, O Greece, and made thee as the sword of a mighty man.

## Examples of multiple fulfillment.

 Jesus in Matt 24 refers to a future Abomination standing in the holy place (temple area), quoting Daniel 11: (Daniel's prophecy ~538AD)

Matthew 24:15 When ye therefore shall see the **abomination of desolation**, spoken of by **Daniel the prophet**, stand in the holy place, (whoso readeth, let him understand:)

<u>Dan 11:31-32</u> And arms shall stand on his part, and they shall pollute the sanctuary of strength, and shall take away the daily sacrifice, and they shall place the abomination that **maketh desolate**. And such as do wickedly against the covenant shall he corrupt by flatteries: but the people that do know their God shall be strong, and do exploits.

- Daniel 11's first (or shadow) fulfillment was with Ephipanus (~175BC).
- He caused sacrifices to cease and erected a blasphemous statue in the temple.

## Examples of multiple fulfillment.

**But clearly Jesus is also referring** to a more dramatic **Desolation**, after the Messiah is 'cut-off', now quoting Daniel 9:

<u>Daniel 9:26-27</u> And after threescore and two weeks **shall Messiah be cut off,** (Jesus killed ~30AD) but not for himself: and the people (Romans) of the prince that shall come (antichrist) shall destroy the city and the sanctuary; (second destruction of Jerusalem in 70AD) and the end thereof shall be with a flood, and unto the end of the war desolations (emptying out) are determined.

And he (antichrist) shall confirm the covenant with many for one week: and in the midst of the week he (the antichrist) shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease (terminate the temple offerings), and for the overspreading of abominations he shall make it desolate (emptying out of the temple and Jerusalem for the purpose of blasphemies), even until the consummation (the millennium, the completion of the 1260 day prophesies), and that determined shall be poured upon the desolate.

(Note the **three** dual fulfillment aspects :The sacrifices the abomination & the desolation)

# Why are multiple fulfillments important?

- The most notable example of interpretational blundering are by those saying The 'Abomination' (ref Daniel) has already occurred, and was Antiochus Epiphanus's statue in ~175BC, hence this prophecy 'doesn't apply' anymore.
- However, Jesus applies Dan.9, 200 years later (in Matt 24:15, approx 30AD). He talks of a time 'not yet' when another abomination will occur. Clearly Jesus places this abomination in the future, and thus speaks of a second fulfilment of Dan 9:27. This will occur just before the 'gathering of the elect' as per Matt 24:31.

# Why are the dates important?

When considering foreshadowing, or multiple fulfilments, some fulfilment options must be excluded because they have already happened.

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Most yellow highlighted prophets above warn about their coming punishment by Assyria & Babylon, taking them out of their country, as slaves in exile.

**After** the exile Assyria/Babylon are no more, hence dual fulfilment must exclude this option, e.g. Zechariah could not have prophesied about the **first fall of Jerusalem**, an event which had already occurred during the Babylonian invasion, but about some future 'fall'.




### **Prophesies of Joel:**

Joel 1: Historic chapter:Locusts invade and descend on Judah.Devastation by drought and fire follows the plague.People lament, howling, in shame and sackcloth.

Joel 2-3: Prophetic chapters: The Day of the Lord is near, dark and gloomy. It's a great and terrible day, the heavens tremble. Armies will descend on the Land, like locusts.

> Fear not, be glad, rejoice; He will restore you. Whosoever calls on the name of the Lord is delivered. Deliverance to the remnant whom the Lord shall call. The wicked and heathen will be judged.



2 Hear this, ye old men, and give ear, all ye inhabitants whe land. Has this been in your days, or even in the days of your fathers?
3 Tell ye your children of it, and let your children tell their children, and their children another generation.


5 Awake, ye drunkards, Reweep; and howl, all ye drinkers of wine, because of the new wine; for it is cut off from your void

10 The field is wasted, the land mourns; for the corn is wasted: the new wine is dried up, the oil languishes.




11 Be ye ashamed, O ye husbandmen; howl, O ye vinedressers, for the wheat and for the barley; because the harvest of the field is perished.

12 The vine is dried up, and the fig tree languishes; the pomegranate tree, the palm tree also, and the apple tree, even all the trees of the field, are withered: because joy is withered away from the sons of men.
13 Gird yourselves, and lament, ye priests: <u>howl, ye ministers of the altar</u>: come, lie all night in sackcloth, ye ministers of my God: for the meat offering and the drink offering is withholden from the house of your God.
14 Sanctify ye a fast, call a solemn assembly, gather the elders and all the inhabitants of the land into the house of the LORD your God, and cry unto the LORD,

# 15 Alas for the day! for the <u>day of the LORD</u> is at hand, and as a destruction from the Almighty shall it come.

16 Is not the meat cut off before our eyes, yea, joy and gladness from the house of our God? 17 The seed is rotten under their clods, the garners are laid desolate, the barns are broken down; for the corn is withered. 18 How do the beasts groan! the herds of cattle are perplexed, because they have no pasture; yea, the flocks of sheep are made desolate.

19 O LORD, to thee will I cry: for the fire hath devoured the pastures of the wilderness, and the flame hath burned all the trees of the field. 20 <u>The beasts of the field cry also unto thee</u>: for the rivers of waters are dried up, and the fire hath devoured the pastures of the wilderness.



**2** Blow ye the trumpet in Zion, and sound an alarm in my holy mountain: let all the inhabitants of the land tremble: for the **day of the LORD cometh**, for it is nigh at hand;

2 <u>A day of darkness and of gloominess</u>, a day of clouds and <u>of thick darkness</u>, as the morning spread upon the mountains: a great people and a strong; there hath <u>not been ever the like</u>, neither shall be any more after it, even to the years of many generations.

3 A fire devours before them; and behind them a flame burns: the land is as the garden of Eden before them, and behind them a desolate wilderness; yea, and nothing shall escape them.

4 The appearance of them is as the appearance of horses; and as horsemen, so shall they run.

5 Like the noise of chariots on the tops of mountains shall they leap, like the noise of a flame of fire that devours the stubble, as a strong people set in battle array.


6 Before their face the people shall be much pained: all faces shall gather blackness.

7 They shall run like mighty men; they shall climb the wall like men of war; and they shall march every one on his ways, and they shall not break their ranks:

8 Neither shall one thrust another; they shall walk every one in his path: and **when they fall upon the sword, they shall not be wounded**.

9 They shall run to and fro in the city; they shall **run upon the wall**, they shall **climb up upon the houses**; they shall enter in at the windows like a thief.

10 The earth shall quake before them; the heavens shall tremble: the sun and the moon shall be dark, and the stars shall withdraw their shining:



<sup>11</sup> And the LORD shall utter his voice before his army: for his camp is very great: for he is strong that executes his word: for **the day of the LORD** is great and very terrible; and who can abide it?

<sup>12</sup> Therefore also now, saith the LORD, turn ye even to me with all your heart, and with fasting, and with weeping, and with mourning:

<sup>13</sup> And rend your heart, and not your garments, and turn unto the LORD your God: for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and of great kindness, and repents him of the evil.

<sup>14</sup> Who knows if he will return and repent, and leave a blessing behind him; even a meat offering and a drink offering unto the LORD your God?

<sup>15</sup> Blow the trumpet in Zion, sanctify a fast, call a solemn assembly:

<sup>16</sup> Gather the people, sanctify the congregation, assemble the elders, gather the children, and those that suck the breasts: let the bridegroom go forth of his chamber, and the bride out of her closet.

<sup>17</sup> Let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep between the porch and the altar, and let them say, Spare thy people, O LORD, and give not thine heritage to reproach, that the heathen should rule over them: wherefore should they say among the people, Where is their God?

<sup>18</sup> Then will the LORD be jealous for his land, and pity his people.

<sup>19</sup>Yea, the LORD will answer and say unto his people, Behold, I will send you corn, and wine, and oil, and ye shall be satisfied therewith: and I will no more make you a reproach among the heathen:

<sup>20</sup> But I will remove far off from you the northern army, and will drive him into a land barren and desolate, with his face toward the east sea, and his hinder part toward the utmost sea, and his stink shall come up, and his ill savour shall come up, because he hath done great things.

<sup>21</sup> Fear not, O land; be glad and rejoice: for the LORD will do great things.




<sup>5</sup> Because ye have taken my silver and my gold, and have carried into your temples my goodly pleasant things:

<sup>13</sup> Put ye in the sickle, for the harvest is ripe: come, get you down; for the press is full, the fats overflow; for their wickedness is great.


<sup>14</sup> Multitudes, multitudes in the valley of decision: for the day of the LORD is near in the valley of decision. <sup>15</sup> The sun and the moon shall be darkened, and the stars shall withdraw their shining.

<sup>16</sup> The LORD also shall roar out of Zion, and utter his voice from Jerusalem; and the <u>heavens and the earth</u> <u>shall shake</u>: but the LORD will be the hope of his people, and the strength of the children of Israel.

<sup>17</sup> So shall ye know that I am the Lord your God dwelling in Zion, my holy mountain: then shall Jerusalem be holy, and there shall no strangers pass through her any more.

18 And it shall come to pass in that day, that the mountains shall drop down new wine, and the hills shall flow with milk, and all the rivers of Judah shall flow with waters, and a fountain shall come forth out of the house of the Lord, and shall water the valley of Shittim.

19 Egypt shall be a desolation, and Edom shall be a desolate wilderness, for the violence against the children of Judah, because they have shed innocent blood in their land.20 But Judah shall dwell for ever, and Jerusalem from generation to generation. <sup>21</sup> For I will cleanse their blood that I have not cleansed: for the LORD dwells in Zion.

### Zechariah 12 to 14 : Keys to interpreting Zechariah 12 to 14


"and they shall look upon me whom they have pierced, and they shall mourn for him, as one mourns for his only son, and shall be in bitterness for him, as one that is in bitterness for his firstborn. (Zech 12:10)". This is the first key-verse from Zechariah, which allows us to build most of our 'end-time prophecy' interpretation about the repentance of Israel's remnant. Similar to Matthew 24:29-31, this particular piece of the puzzle, if one places it right, will help us to place the remainder of puzzle-pieces smoothly. This verse places the repentance of Israel at Armaggeddon. 'That Day'

The second key: Zechariah 12 & 13 makes nine references to 'That Day'. 'That Day' refers to the events regarding Armageddon. There reference here is NOT to 'the day of the Lord' as in Zechariah 14. Clearly Zech 12 and Revelation 19 (&16-14-16) speak of the <u>same event</u>, when all the people of the earth are gathered together against Jerusalem. *Zech 12: v4, "In that day, saith the LORD, I will smite every horse with astonishment…(v9) in that day, that I will seek to destroy all the nations that come against Jerusalem".* 

This lines up with Revelation 16:14,16 *"For they are the spirits of devils, working miracles, which go forth unto the kings of the earth and of the whole world, to gather them to the battle of that great day of God Almighty. ..16 And he gathered them together into a place called in the Hebrew tongue Armageddon...Rev 19:19 And I saw the beast, and the kings of the earth, and their armies, gathered together to make war against him that sat on the horse, and against his army." This is the day Jesus, on the white horse destroys the armies of the nations.(<i>day of God is not* 'day of the Lord') Hence, as per the next verse in Zechariah, the repentance of Israel occurs on that same day, they see Jesus (v10), when *'...they shall look upon me whom they have pierced, and they shall mourn for him..*"

Now compare this to Zechariah 14:1} Behold, the **day of the LORD** comes, and thy spoil shall be divided in the midst of thee. {14:2} For I will gather all nations against Jerusalem to battle; and the city shall be taken, and the houses rifled, and the women ravished; and half of the city shall go forth into captivity, and the residue of the people shall not be cut off from the city. {14:3} Then shall the LORD go forth, and fight against those nations, as when he fought in the day of battle.

Zech 12-13 speak of Armageddon and Zech 14 speaks of the captivity of Jerusalem's inhabitors. Zech 14 is clearly not the Armaggeddon event, hence is this perhaps the nations gathered just before the second coming of Jesus, at the 6th seal, at the resurrection and the rapture? And what do we do with Jesus's feet on the mount of Olives, some verses later? These two verses exemplify the dilemma we face as attempt to line these up with Jesus's words and with Revelation. This is where the principle of weaving is employed in earnest, in Zechariah 14.



### Zechariah 1

1 In the eighth month, in the second year of Darius, came the word of the LORD unto Zechariah, the son of Berechiah, the son of Iddo the prophet, saying, <sup>2</sup> The LORD hath been sore displeased with your fathers.

<sup>3</sup> Therefore say thou unto them, Thus saith the LORD of hosts; Turn ye unto me, saith the LORD of hosts, and I will turn unto you, saith the LORD of hosts.

<sup>4</sup> Be ye not as your fathers, unto whom the former prophets have cried, saying, Thus saith the LORD of hosts; Turn ye now from your evil ways, and from your evil doings: but they did not hear, nor hearken unto me, saith the LORD.


<sup>5</sup> Your fathers, where are they? and the prophets, do they live for ever?

<sup>6</sup> But my words and my statutes, which I commanded my servants the prophets, did they not take hold of your fathers? and they returned and said, Like as the LORD of hosts thought to do unto us, according to our ways, and according to our doings, so hath he dealt with us.

<sup>7</sup> Upon the four and twentieth day of the eleventh month, which is the month Sebat, in the second year of Darius, came the word of the LORD unto Zechariah, the son of Berechiah, the son of Iddo the prophet, saying,

<sup>8</sup>I saw by night, and behold a man riding upon a red horse, and he stood among the myrtle trees that were in the bottom; and behind him were there red horses, speckled, and white.

<sup>9</sup> Then said I, O my lord, what are these? And the angel that talked with me said unto me, I will shew thee what these be.



10 And the man that stood among the myrtle trees answered and said, These are they whom the Lord hath sent to walk to and fro through the earth.

11 And they answered the angel of the Lord that stood among the myrtle trees, and said, We have walked to and fro through the earth, and, behold, all the earth sitteth still, and is at rest.

12 Then the angel of the Lord answered and said, O Lord of hosts, how long wilt thou not have mercy on Jerusalem and on the cities of Judah, against which thou hast had indignation these threescore and ten years? 13 And the Lord answered the angel that talked with me with good words and comfortable words. 14 So the angel that communed with me said unto me, Cry thou, saying, Thus saith the Lord of hosts; I am jealous for Jerusalem and for Zion with a great jealousy.


15 And I am very sore displeased with the heathen that are at ease: for I was but a little displeased, and they helped forward the affliction.

16 Therefore thus saith the Lord; I am returned to Jerusalem with mercies: my house shall be built in it, saith the Lord of hosts, and a line shall be stretched forth upon Jerusalem.

17 Cry yet, saying, Thus saith the Lord of hosts; My cities through prosperity shall yet be spread abroad; and the Lord shall yet comfort Zion, and shall yet choose Jerusalem.

18 Then lifted I up mine eyes, and saw, and behold four horns.

19 And I said unto the angel that talked with me, What be these? And he answered me, These are the horns which have scattered Judah, Israel, and Jerusalem. 20 And the Lord shewed me four carpenters. 21 Then said I, What come these to do? <sup>9</sup> For, behold, I will shake mine hand upon them, and they shall be a spoil to their servants: and ye shall know that the LORD of hosts hath sent me.

<sup>10</sup> Sing and rejoice, O daughter of Zion: for, lo, I come, and I will dwell in the midst of thee, saith the LORD. <sup>11</sup> And many nations shall be joined to the LORD in that day, and shall be my people: and I will dwell in the midst of thee, and thou shalt know that the LORD of hosts hath sent me unto thee.

<sup>12</sup> And the LORD shall inherit Judah his portion in the holy land, and shall choose Jerusalem again.





<sup>2</sup> In the first chariot were red horses; and in the second chariot black horses;



6 <sup>9</sup> And the word of the LORD came unto me, saying,



#### Zechariah 7:1-7


**7** And it came to pass in the fourth year of king Darius, that the word of the LORD came unto Zechariah in the fourth day of the ninth month, even in Chisleu;

<sup>9</sup> Thus speaks the LORD of hosts, saying, Execute true judgment, and show mercy and compassions every man to his brother:


<sup>10</sup> And oppress not the widow, nor the fatherless, the stranger, nor the poor; and let none of you imagine evil against his brother in your heart.

<sup>3</sup> Thus saith the LORD; I am returned unto Zion, and will dwell in the midst of Jerusalem: and Jerusalem shall be called a city of truth; and the mountain of the LORD of hosts the holy mountain.





<sup>18</sup> And the word of the LORD of hosts came unto me, saying,



<sup>4</sup> Behold, the LORD will cast her out, and he will smite her power in the sea; and she shall be devoured with fire.



<sup>10</sup> And I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim, and the horse from Jerusalem, and the battle bow shall be cut off: and he shall speak peace unto the heathen: and his dominion shall be from sea even to sea, and from the river even to the ends of the earth.

<sup>11</sup> As for thee also, by the blood of thy covenant I have sent forth thy prisoners out of the pit wherein is no water.

<sup>12</sup> Turn you to the strong hold, ye prisoners of hope: even to day do I declare that I will render double unto thee;



<sup>16</sup> For, lo, I will raise up a shepherd in the land, which shall not visit those that be cut off, neither shall seek the young one, nor heal that that is broken, nor feed that that standeth still: but he shall eat the flesh of the fat, and tear their claws in pieces.

<sup>17</sup> Woe to the idol shepherd that leaves the flock! the sword shall be upon his arm, and upon his right eye: his arm shall be clean dried up, and his right eye shall be utterly darkened.



### Zechariah 13 :1 - 6


**13** In that day there shall be a fountain opened to the house of David and to the inhabitants of Jerusalem for sin and for uncleanness.

<sup>2</sup> And it shall come to pass in that day, saith the LORD of hosts, that I will cut off the names of the idols out of the land, and they shall no more be remembered: and also I will cause the prophets and the unclean spirit to pass out of the land.

<sup>3</sup> And it shall come to pass, that when any shall yet prophesy, then his father and his mother that begat him shall say unto him, Thou shalt not live; for thou speaks lies in the name of the LORD: and his father and his mother that begat him shall thrust him through when he prophesies.

<sup>4</sup> And it shall come to pass in that day, that the prophets shall be ashamed every one of his vision, when he hath prophesied; neither shall they wear a rough garment to deceive: <sup>5</sup> But he shall say, I am no prophet, I am an husbandman; for man taught me to keep cattle from my youth.

<sup>6</sup> And one shall say unto him, What are these wounds in thine hands? Then he shall answer, Those with which I was wounded in the house of my friends.




#### Zechariah 13:7-9

#### 13

<sup>7</sup> Awake, O sword, against my shepherd, and against the man that is my fellow, says the LORD of hosts: smite the shepherd, and the sheep shall be scattered: and I will turn mine hand upon the little ones.

<sup>8</sup> And it shall come to pass, that in all the land, saith the LORD, two parts therein shall be cut off and die; but <u>the third shall be left therein</u>.

<sup>9</sup> And <u>I will bring the third part through the fire, and will refine them as silver is</u> <u>refined,</u> and will try them as gold is tried: they shall call on my name, and I will hear them: I will say, It is my people: and they shall say, The LORD is my God.



# Zechariah 14 :1 - 7

Behold, the <u>day of the LORD</u> cometh, and thy spoil shall be divided in the midst of thee.

<sup>2</sup> For I will gather all nations against Jerusalem to battle; and the city shall be taken, and the houses rifled, and the women ravished; and half of the city shall go forth into captivity, and the residue of the people shall not be cut off from the city.


(weave into the future)

<sup>3</sup> Then shall the LORD go forth, and fight against those nations, as when he fought in the day of battle. (weave back to 'that day')

<sup>4</sup> And his feet shall stand in **that day** (His 2<sup>nd</sup> coming) upon the mount of Olives, which is before Jerusalem on the east, and the mount of Olives shall cleave in the midst thereof toward the east and toward the west, and there shall be a very great valley; and half of the mountain shall remove toward the north, and half of it toward the south.

<sup>5</sup> And ye shall flee to the valley of the mountains; for the valley of the mountains shall reach unto Azal: yea, ye shall flee, like as ye fled from before the earthquake in the days of Uzziah king of Judah:... (weave into the future)... and the LORD my God **shall** come, and all the saints with thee. (weave back to 'that day')

<sup>6</sup> And it shall come to pass in **that day** (2<sup>nd</sup> coming), that the light shall not be clear, nor dark:<sup>7</sup> But it shall be **one day** which shall be known to the LORD (His 2<sup>nd</sup> coming), not day, nor night: but it shall come to pass, that at evening time it shall be light.



#### Zechariah 14 :8 - 13

<sup>8</sup> And it shall be in <u>that day</u> (weave to the Millennium), that living waters shall go out from Jerusalem; half of them toward the former sea, and half of them toward the hinder sea: in summer and in winter shall it be.

<sup>9</sup> And the LORD shall be king over all the earth: in that day (the Millennium) shall there be one LORD, and his name one.

<sup>10</sup> All the land shall be turned as a plain from Geba to Rimmon south of Jerusalem: and it shall be lifted up, and inhabited in her place, from Benjamin's gate unto the place of the first gate, unto the corner gate, and from the tower of Hananeel unto the king's winepresses.

<sup>11</sup> And men shall dwell in it, and there shall be no more utter destruction; but Jerusalem shall be safely inhabited.

(weave back to Armageddon),

<sup>12</sup> And this shall be the plague wherewith the LORD will smite all the people that have fought against Jerusalem; Their flesh shall consume away while they stand upon their feet, and their eyes shall consume away in their holes, and their tongue shall consume away in their mouth.

<sup>13</sup> And it shall come to pass in **that day**, that a great tumult from the LORD shall be among them; and they shall lay hold every one on the hand of his neighbour, and his hand shall rise up against the hand of his neighbour.

# Zechariah 14 :14 -21

<sup>14</sup> And Judah also shall fight at Jerusalem; and the wealth of all the heathen round about shall be gathered together, gold, and silver, and apparel, in great abundance.

<sup>15</sup> And so shall be the plague of the horse, of the mule, of the camel, and of the ass, and of all the beasts that shall be in these tents, as this plague.

(weave to the Millennium),

<sup>16</sup> And it shall come to pass, that every one that is left of all the nations which came against Jerusalem shall even go up from year to year to worship the King, the LORD of hosts, and to keep the feast of tabernacles.

<sup>17</sup> And it shall be, that whoso will not come up of all the families of the earth unto Jerusalem to worship the King, the LORD of hosts, even upon them shall be no rain.

<sup>18</sup> And if the family of Egypt go not up, and come not, that have no rain; there shall be the plague, wherewith the LORD will smite the heathen that come not up to keep the feast of tabernacles. <sup>19</sup> This shall be the punishment of Egypt, and the punishment of all nations that come not up to keep the feast of tabernacles.

<sup>20</sup> In that day shall there be upon the bells of the horses, HOLINESS UNTO THE LORD; and the pots in the LORD's house shall be like the bowls before the altar.

<sup>21</sup> Yea, every pot in Jerusalem and in Judah shall be holiness unto the LORD of hosts: and all they that sacrifice shall come and take of them, and seethe therein: and in that day there shall be no more the Canaanite in the house of the LORD of hosts.
