

Below a Summary of Revelation 6 & 7 (from session 1), with Revelation 8-11 now added.

This summary covers the first six seal events up to the 7th trumpet, after which: 'the kingdoms of this world become the kingdoms of our LORD, and of his Christ, and He shall reign for ever and ever.' (Rev 11:15)



Revelation 11 is the end of the first parallel sequence, as the narrative re-starts at Revelation 12 with the 'birth of Christ' in Rev 12:5. More about this later.

REVELATION 8 & 9:

The seventh seal introduces the trumpet judgements of God's Wrath.



<u>The seventh seal</u> is now opened, and there is a half hour silence in heaven: All goes quiet as the seven angels prepare to sound their trumpets.

All the prayers of the saints are presented to Father God. Many of these prayers would contain cries for justice brought in the tears of persecution and suffering.


It seems that Father God has reserved his response to all the cries for justice and vengeance over the centuries for this moment.

As it approaches, all goes quiet, in awe of what is to come: The revelation of God's stored-up anger, stored up patiently over millennia. His just wrath is about to engulf wickedness and the wicked.


6 And the seven angels which had the seven trumpets prepared themselves to sound:




7 The first angel sounded, and there followed hail and fire mingled with blood, and they were cast upon the earth: and the third part of trees was burnt up, and all green grass was burnt up.



8 And the second angel sounded, and as it were a **great mountain burning** with fire was cast into the sea: and the third part of the sea became blood; 9 And the third part of the creatures which were in the sea, and had life, died; and the third part of the ships were destroyed.




10 And the third angel sounded, and there **fell a great star** from heaven, burning as it were a lamp, and it fell upon the third part of the rivers, and upon the fountains of waters; 11 And the name of the star is called Wormwood: and the third part of the waters became wormwood; and many men died of the waters, because they were made bitter.



12 And the fourth angel sounded, and the third part of the **sun** was smitten, and the third part of the **moon**, and the third part of the **stars**; so as the third part of them was darkened, and the day shone not for a third part of it, and the night likewise.

The three Woes: The last three trumpets are now proclaimed as the 'three woes' by an angel: v13 And I beheld, and heard an angel flying through the midst of heaven, saying with a loud voice, **Woe, woe, woe,** to the inhabiters of the earth by reason of the other voices of the trumpet of the three angels, **which are yet to sound!**

The 5th Trumpet: And the fifth angel sounded, and I saw a star fall from heaven unto the earth: and to him was given the key of the bottomless pit.² And he opened the bottomless pit; and there arose a smoke out of the pit, as the smoke of a great furnace; and the sun and the air were darkened by reason of the smoke of the pit.³ And there came out of the smoke locusts upon the earth: and unto them was given power, as the scorpions of the earth have power.⁴ And it was commanded them that they should not hurt the grass of the earth, neither any green thing, neither any tree; but only those men which have not the seal of God in their foreheads.⁵ And to them it was given that they should not kill them, but that they should be tormented five months: and their torment was as the torment of a scorpion, when he strikes a man.⁶ And in those days shall men seek death, and shall not find it; and shall desire to die, and death shall flee from them.



7 And the shapes of the locusts were like unto horses prepared unto battle; and on their heads were as it were crowns like gold, and their faces were as the faces of men. 8 And they had hair as the hair of women, and their teeth were as the teeth of lions. 9 And they had breastplates, as it were breastplates of iron; and the sound of their wings was as the sound of chariots of many horses running to battle.

10 And they had tails like unto scorpions, and there were stings in their tails: and their power was to hurt men five months. 11 And they had a king over them, which is the angel of the bottomless pit, whose name in the Hebrew tongue is Abaddon, but in the Greek tongue hath his name Apollyon.

Regarding Abaddon / Apollyon:

- Satan is referred to as the great dragon, the devil, Satan, serpent, Lucifer and the accuser. <u>He is never called</u> **Abaddon/Apollyon**.
- Satan will be thrown into the bottomless pit for 1,000 years, by the angel that has the key of the bottomless pit. (Rev 20:1-3)
- Satan does not rule over hell. Jesus does. (Rev 1:18, Rev 14:10)
- Satan will be cast into the lake of fire and brimstone and he will be tormented there. (Is 14:12-15, Rev 20:10)

JESUS has 'the keys of hell and of death' (Rev 1:18)

Satan will 'be brought down to hell, to the sides of the pit' (Is 14:15)

Therefore, it seems that Abaddon/Apollyon is a 'Destruction' angel from God.

The sixth Trumpet: And the sixth angel sounded, and I heard a voice from the four horns of the golden altar which is before God, Saying to the sixth angel which had the trumpet, **Loose the four angels** which are bound in the great river Euphrates. And the four angels were loosed, which were prepared for an hour, and a day, and a month, and a year, for **to slay the third part of men.**

And the number of the army of the horsemen were two hundred thousand thousand: and I heard the number of them. And thus I saw the horses in the vision, and them that sat on them, having breastplates of fire, and of jacinth, and brimstone: and the heads of the horses were as the heads of lions; and out of their mouths issued fire and smoke and brimstone.

By these three was the third part of men killed, by **the fire, and by the smoke, and by the brimstone,** which issued out of their mouths. For their power is in their mouth,

and in their tails: for their tails were like unto serpents, and had heads, and with them they do hurt.



walk). Murders. Sorceries. Fornication. Thefts.

20 And the rest of the men which were not killed by these plagues yet **repented not** of the works of their hands, that they should not worship devils, and idols of gold, and silver, and brass, and stone, and of wood: which neither can see, nor hear, nor walk:

21 Neither repented they of their murders, nor of their sorceries, nor of their fornication, nor of their thefts.

Who are the 4 angels that are bound in the Euphrates?

The Euphrates is mentioned in Genesis 3:23-24 '²³ Therefore the Lord God sent him forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from whence he was taken. ²⁴ So he drove out the man; and he placed at the east of the garden of Eden <u>CHERUBIMS</u>, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to keep the way of the tree of life.'

Could it be that these CHERUBIMS are the 4 angels bound in the **Euphrates**?

Gen 2:10 '10 And a river went out of Eden to water the garden; and from thence it was parted, and became into four heads.'

'the 1st is Pison (compasses the whole land of Havilah)' (Gen 2:11).

'the 2nd is Gihon (compasses the whole land of Ethiopia)' (Gen 2:13).

'the 3rd is Hiddekel (goes toward the east of Assyria and

the 4th river is **EUPHRATES**.' (Gen 2:14)

REVELATION 10: The seven thunders.

John sees a magnificent angel crying out with a loud voice. However, we're not told what he said. When the voices of 'Seven thunders' respond, John is instructed: "**Seal up** those things which the seven thunders uttered and write them not."

This is much like the Daniel chapter 12 prophecy, where the angel orders Daniel that the events are 'sealed until the time of the end', John also must withhold the information.

This seems to align with Jesus' words to 'watch, pray and be ready', because it seems that God will reveal more and more detail as we approach the 'time of the end'.



I saw another mighty angel come down from heaven, clothed with a cloud: and a rainbow was upon his head, and his face was as it were the sun, and his feet as pillars of fire:

2 And he had in his hand a little book open: and he set his right foot upon the sea, and his left foot on the earth,

3 And cried with a loud voice, as when a lion roars: and when he had cried, seven thunders uttered their voices.

4 And when the seven thunders had uttered their voices, I was about to write: and I heard a voice from heaven saying unto me, **Seal up** those things which the seven thunders uttered, and **write them not.**

Time no longer:

The second half of Revelation 10 emphasises that the 'Wrath of God' narrative is nearing its end by declaring that there is 'time no longer'. The last angel is ready to sound his trumpet (and does so in Rev 11), which introduces the final judgements and the declaration the arrival of the kingdom.

"5 And the angel which I saw stand upon the sea and upon the earth lifted up his hand to heaven,
6 And sware by him that lives for ever and ever, who created heaven, and the things that therein are, and the earth,
and the things that therein are, and the sea, and the things which are therein, that there should be time no longer
7 But in the days of the voice of the seventh angel, when he shall begin to sound, the mystery of God should be
finished, as he hath declared to his servants the prophets.



'As he has declared to his servants the prophets': Daniel's prophecy is remarkably like Rev 10!


Daniel even adds the 3.5 year 'scattering of the holy people', as referred to in Rev 11:2!

Dan 12:7 ⁷ And I heard the man clothed in linen, which was upon the waters of the river, when he held up his right hand and his left hand unto heaven, and sware by him that liveth for ever that it shall be for a time, times, and an half; and when he shall have accomplished to scatter the power of the holy people, all these things shall be finished.





Finally John is instructed to eat the book held by the mighty angel. It was sweet to the mouth but bitter in the belly. This probably indicates something about the utterances of the seven thunders, perhaps that the revenge against the wickedness of the evildoers is sweet, but the doing of it was nevertheless bitter and detestable.



Revelation 11:


The Time of the Gentiles. (v1,2), the two witnesses and the 7th trumpet

John is instructed to measure the temple but not the outer court.

God gives the outer court to the Gentiles, for their purposes. This could mean that it is given to the Gentiles to erect/set up the 'Abomination of Desolation' (refer to session 2), i.e. that they are allowed to by God to do it. Revelation 13 prophesies that this terrible image (or idol) of desolation will be able to move, speak and perhaps even kill.

The temple area itself, which John has to measure, seems to be an 'exclusion zone' to the Gentiles. The temple area, it seems, has been 'set apart', a holy place reserved for God's purposes. Whether this is a symbolic temple or a rebuilt 3rd temple on earth is not quite certain.

Interestingly, John is also asked to measure, with the rod, those that worship in the temple.



Where will John measure the temple of God?

The first questions are: 'which temple', and 'where is it?'. Is it a rebuilt temple on earth? If so, will God inhabit a man-built and man-initiated temple so it can be called the 'temple of God'?


The New Testament clearly states that believers are now the temple **of God** (1 Cor 3:16-17, 1 Cor 6:19) on earth, this is God's habitation (Eph 2:21-22), which makes any man-made temple obsolete. However, the mention of the Gentiles and the treading underfoot in verse 2 does seem to implicate a rebuilt temple on earth.

In addition, from the surrounding verses (v19), it could indicate that John may have to symbolically measure the temple in heaven: "And the temple of God was opened in heaven, and there was seen in his temple the ark of his testament."

How does this all fit? We have no answer as yet.

The Desolation of Jerusalem:

In session 2, the link between the 'Desolation of Jerusalem' and the 'Abomination of Desolation' was explained. **The 'Desolation of Jerusalem' and the 'Abomination of Desolation' are coincident**: They are 'bookended' by the same events on either side and appear on the timeline simultaneously, as seen below:



THE TIME OF THE GENTILES:

Rev 11:2 But the court which is without the temple leave out, and measure it not; for it is **given unto the Gentiles**: and the holy city shall they tread under foot forty and two months.




It appears that the Gentiles will have full control of Jerusalem in the last days, treading it 'underfoot' for 3.5 years (42 months). In Session 2 we have also seen the following verse about the 'treading down' of Jerusalem by the Gentiles:

Luke 21:24 "And they shall fall by the edge of the sword, and shall be led away captive into all nations: and Jerusalem shall be <u>trodden down</u> of the Gentiles, until **the <u>times of the Gentiles be fulfilled."</u>**

This most likely occurs when the Antichrist takes control of Jerusalem and sets up an idol or 'image of the beast' on the temple mount. (Revelation 13)

The apostle Paul also writes about the 'time of the Gentiles', pointing out the blindness of Israel to the gospel during the 'time of the Gentiles':

Rom 11:25: For I would not, brethren, that you should be ignorant of this mystery, lest you should be wise in your own conceits; that blindness in part is happened to Israel, until the fulness of the Gentiles be come in.




How long?...Paul clearly states the blindness of Israel will last until the fullness of Gentiles is come in.

From the verses above it is apparent that there is a pause in God's plan with Israel. There is an opportunity, called the 'time of the Gentiles' whereby the unbelieving nations, the Gentiles, may hear about God's plan and may become part of God's family. This opportunity for the Gentiles ends 42 months after the Gentiles (Antichrist) takes full control of Jerusalem. When 'the fullness of the Gentiles' has come in, the blindness of the Jews will be lifted.

Paul states in Romans 11 that <u>a blindness amongst the Jews</u> concerning the gospel has set in, and adds that it will continue throughout the time of the Gentiles.

Summarizing scriptures (details further below) regarding what Isaiah, Jesus, Paul and Revelation reveals about their blindness:

Prophecy of Isaiah on the duration of the blindness and the lack of understanding of the Jews:




Isaiah's prophecy about the blindness of the Jews:


- ".....Shut their eyes, lest they see..."
- '.....and convert, and be healed.'

How long?...

'...Until the cities are wasted...the houses without man and the land utterly desolate.'

Prophecies by Jesus on the duration of the blindness of the Jews to the gospel:







How long?...UNTIL ye shall say:

Blessed is He that comes in the name of the Lord!

Prophecies by Paul on the duration of the blindness of the Jews to the gospel:





How long?... Paul states: ..till the fullness of the Gentiles is come in...

However, God has always reserved a small remnant (Rom 11v5) of Jewish believers for himself during times of apostasy, like he did in the time of Elijah.

God's specific dealings with Israel, during this blindness, seem to be suspended until a future time when his plan resumes. The 'lifting of their blindness' occurs when he reveals himself to them, and rescues them, just before Armageddon, when they 'look upon me whom they have pierced' and mourn bitterly for their rejection of Him. (Zech 12:7-10)

v9 And it shall come to pass in that day, that I will seek to destroy all the nations that come **against Jerusalem.** [i.e. Armageddon]

10 And I will pour upon the house of David, and upon the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the spirit of grace and of supplications: and they shall look upon me whom they have pierced, and they shall mourn for him, as one mourns for his only son, and shall be in bitterness for him, as one that is in bitterness for his firstborn.

This seems a clear prophecy that their repentance happens when they 'look upon him' at the time of Armageddon. That is at the end: when Jesus comes on the White Horse to establish his kingdom on this earth.

Thereafter which he revives and restores the believing Jews to populate the millennial Jerusalem and the millennial Israel. (Hosea 6:2)

Summary: 'Blindness in part happened to Israel.' (Rom 11:25)

'Until fullness of the Gentiles have come in.' (Rom 11:25, Luke 21:24)

'Until the cities be wasted without inhabitant, and the houses without man, and the land be utterly desolate,' (Is 6:10-11)

'Until Jerusalem be trodden down by the Gentiles.' (Luke 21:24)


'Until ye shall say, Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord.' (Matt 23:36-39, Luke 13:32-35)

Question: Because the Jews will still be unbelieving at the time of the rapture, will they then have to pass through the time of the outpouring of God's wrath to be rescued at the 11th hour?

Answer: It seems from Revelation 12 that those Jews responding to the instruction to 'flee', at the Abomination of desolation' (marking Antichrists move on Jerusalem- ref session 2), that they will be protected and refined 'in the wilderness' during the time of the outpouring of God's wrath. (Refer to session 4)

There in the wilderness, it seems, will they experience God's supernatural provision and protection, such as it was during the Exodus (during Moses' time), when God provided food and water supernaturally.

Jesus reveals himself to them after this time, on the White horse, when their desert experience with God has readied them to accept that Jesus is the Messiah!




What about the Jews not fleeing (remaining in Judea) or who live elsewhere?


Those that do not flee and remain in Judea: (summary):

- 'Jerusalem shall be **trodden down** by the Gentiles.' (Luke 21:24)
- 'The court outside the temple is given to the Gentiles. They shall tread the holy city under foot for 42 months.' (Rev 11:2)
- 'Great distress in the land wrath upon this people. Fall by the sword, led away captive into all nations.' (Luke 21:23-24)
- 'Jerusalem, house will be left desolate.' (Matt 23:37)
- 'The cities be wasted without inhabitant, and the houses without man, and the land be utterly desolate.' (Is 6:11)
- '... the city shall **be taken**, and the houses rifled, & the women ravished; and half of the city shall go forth into **captivity**, and the residue of the people shall not be cut off from the city.' (Zech 14:2)
- 'that it shall be for a time, times, and an half; and when he shall have accomplished to <u>scatter</u> the power of the holy people', all these things shall be finished.' (Dan 12:7)

Daniel prophesies extensively about the 'time of the end' in Daniel chapter 12:



What about believers?: As we have seen in the previous sessions, believers are raptured before the wrath of God is poured out. There seems no mention of believers after the rapture, other than the Jews, saved after the 3.5 yrs.



WHAT ABOUT BELIEVERS / THE SAVED / CHRISTIANS?

- Will <u>SEE/know</u> when the Abomination of Desolation is set up.
- Will <u>SEE/know</u> when Jerusalem is surrounded by armies.
- Will go through the Great Tribulation
- Will be raptured at Jesus' 2nd coming

The two witnesses:

Revelation 11 describes the ministry of the two witnesses. Their ministry is to prophesy to the entire world, but it seems also to the Jews in particular. In reading this chapter it seems clear that they operate out of Jerusalem, which will be desolated by the Antichrist at some point during their ministry.

However, they will be 'untouchable'. They will continue to be 'untouchable' for 3.5 years as a demonstration God's superior power over the Antichrist, the false Messiah, during his reign.



The most amazing feats of the two witnesses are in protecting themselves. They experience from God a level of miraculous power that seems beyond what has ever been seen.

They will stand up against the fury of the entire Antichrist system. They will devour any enemies attacking them with fire out of their mouths. This power extended to the two witnesses surpasses anything the world has yet witnessed.

In addition they have powers to cause drought, turn water into blood and cause plagues over the entire earth. "These have power to shut heaven, that it rain not in the days of their prophecy: and have power over waters to turn them to blood, and to smite the earth with all plagues, as often as they will." No one on earth will be unaware of their presence, it seems.

The identity of the two witnesses leaves little doubt. The two witnesses of verse 3-4 seem to be none other than Moses and Elijah. The similarities of the supernatural powers given to the two witnesses and those given to Moses and Elijah are obvious. In Exodus 7:20 Moses turns the Nile River waters into blood. In 1 Kings 5:17 Elijah prayed that it would not rain, which it did not for **3.5 years (1260 days)**, reflecting the time of their ministry. This is repeated in James 5:17.





In addition, there is a supernatural aspect to the departure of both. Elijah was taken up by a whirlwind into heaven. One could say he was raptured, spectacularly. Elijah is also referred to as the 'Elijah to come', the end-time prophet in Malachi 4:5-6. Regarding the 'death' of Moses, Jude 9 and Deut. 43:5-7 describe that there was something very significant about the body of Moses.

Only these two humble and obedient men of God, Moses and Elijah, could ever be equal to standing up against the fury of the entire Antichrist system in humility in power. This was demonstrated by Moses against Pharaoh, and by Elijah in the face of Ahab's opposition.


In addition, we recall that Moses' enemies were swallowed up by the earth on one occasion (Num.16:28-33) and turned leprous in an instant on another (Num.12:1-15). Elijah's enemies were devoured by heavenly fire (2Ki.1:9-14).

The reference to the two witnesses as the "two olive trees and the two lampstands standing before the Lord of the earth" (Zech 4:11-14) gives their ministry a distinctly Jewish flavour. It seems that part of their ministry may

specifically be directed towards Israel, perhaps to those who did not flee and did survive the setting up of the Abomination of Desolation.

Their death and resurrection: Three-and-a-half years after their ministry starts, 1260 days to be exact, the witnesses are executed and left on the ground. There may be some significance in their bodies being on display for 3.5 days. Perhaps it is to demonstrate to all that they were truly dead, and that their resurrection is a miracle from God. The witnesses are resurrected and ascend to heaven.

The timescale is shortly before Armageddon, it seems. This is self-evident because the next event, in Verse 15, is the seventh trumpet, announcing the arrival of the 'Kingdom of God'!





If the resurrection of the two witnesses did not move the Jews to accept the Lord Jesus, then only His physical appearance will, when they "shall look upon me whom they have pierced, and they shall mourn for him, as one mourns for his only son, and shall be in bitterness for him, as one that is in bitterness for his firstborn. (Zech 12:10)"

The seventh trumpet:

The end!

In chapter 11 of Revelation the end is announced as the seventh trumpet is blown. The 'wrath of God' will be complete at the end of the 7th trumpet events and God's reign on earth will commence.

The kingdoms of this world become the kingdoms of our LORD, and of his Christ, and He shall reign for ever and ever.' This is followed by worship in Heaven:





The kingdoms of this world are become the kingdoms of our LORD.

Father God and Jesus has promised us a wonderful start to our future, being with Him in His physical presence. A time we can truly look forward to. A vision we can relate to right now, in this present world. A vision of such vividness that it will ignite our collective imaginations: To serve a righteous leader who will transform this present world into the place of love, harmony and peace that we all desire.

- This world leader is Jesus.
- His capital city will be Jerusalem, the renewed and rebuilt capital city of this new world.

• His kingdom rule will last a thousand years, before he wraps up this earth which is still tainted by sin and creates the new heavens and earth.

Our most promising leaders in history, having swept millions off their feet in expectant admiration, have invariably turned from heroes to villains.

Now we can look forward to serve a leader of the most impeccable character, who we can truly admire and who will never fail us. A fitting closure to God's plan to gather a people for Himself. And after that we experience the new heaven and earth, currently even more unimaginable, which is to be our eternal dwelling place of joy, peace and purpose.

The 24 elders saying:

"17 Saying, We give thee thanks, O Lord God Almighty, which art, and was, and art to come; because thou hast taken to thee thy great power, and hast reigned.

18 And the nations were angry, and thy wrath is come, and the time of the dead, that they **should be judged,** and that thou shouldest give **reward unto thy servants** the prophets, and to the saints, and them that fear thy name"

Rewards and Judgement:



The elders confirm in their worship that rewards are about to be released to Father God's servants, but that judgement awaits the wicked and those that destroy the earth with their wickedness.

The prophet Daniel has prophesied extensively about His coming kingdom that would consume all other kingdoms:



The millennium: reigning with Christ for a 1000 years in His kingdom.

Christ's Millennium, a thousand years of His rule on this restored earth, is repeated **six times** in the Rev 20 verses above, 6 times just to make sure we don't miss this! Our expectation is that, when 'all these things are finished', that we will 'kick-off' our eternal life by experiencing a glorious 1000 years in Jesus' presence here on earth. On this very same earth we are on now, but a completely restored and refreshed earth.

A vision of Christ's Millennium, the millennium of rest and restoration of this abused earth, is a vital part of our hope and focus throughout the tribulation.

The New Jerusalem, our eternal abode, would still be in the future, and await us after God's plan, a Sabbath Millennium of rest for this earth, is completed.

But before that, the final battle: **Revelation 16,17 and 19** describe that final battle, the battle of that great day of GOD ALMIGHTY, the arrival the KING OF KINGS and the LORD OF LORDS":



Rewards at the Judgement seat of Christ:

By the blood of Jesus all our sins are blotted out, hence believers will not be judged for our sins. Nevertheless, we all have to appear at the judgement seat of Christ, that we may receive our rewards for our service to Jesus while on earth. Jesus has prepared our inheritance in the kingdom, and we will be apportioned our 'inheritance' in accordance with his mercy and grace, as no one deserves or has claim to anything.

Hence the worship in heaven, as we're all be overwhelmed by God's goodness, despite our failures.





Rev 22:12 And, behold, I come quickly; and my reward is with me, to give every man according as his work shall be. Matt 5:10-12 ¹⁰ Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. ¹¹ Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake. ¹² Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you. Matt 16:27 For the Son of man shall come in the glory of his Father with his angels; and then he shall reward every man according to his works. Heb 11:6 But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and

that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

1 Cor 3:8-14 Now he that planteth and he that watereth are one: and every man shall receive his own reward according to his own labour.

9 For we are labourers together with God:

ye are God's husbandry, ye are God's building.

10 According to the grace of God which is given unto me, as a wise masterbuilder,
I have laid the foundation, and another buildeth thereon.


But let every man take heed how he buildeth thereupon.

12 Now if any man build upon this foundation gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, stubble; 13 Every man's work shall be made manifest:


for the day shall declare it, because it shall be revealed by fire;

²¹ And there fell upon men a great hail out of heaven, every stone about the weight of a talent: and men blasphemed God because of the plague of the hail; for the plague thereof was exceeding great.

In addition, the surface of the earth is reshaped:

Rev 16;20 - And every island fled away, and the mountains were not found.

How many people will be left on earth to enter the millennium in their physical bodies is not revealed. However, there is mention of the nations in Zechariah 14:16-19 "And it shall come to pass, that every one that is **left of all the nations** which came against Jerusalem shall even go up from year to year to worship the King, the LORD of hosts, and to keep the feast of tabernacles."

This provides a clear answer about the millennial inhabitants of the earth. Firstly, the restored and revived Jews will populate Israel, but then also 'every one that is left of all the nations which came against Jerusalem.'

Question: How can revelation 11 already be the end if there are still 11 significant chapters with many events to come?

Answer: The chronology of the end-time narrative is re-set in chapter 12. We can know this because chapter 12 restarts by turning the clock back 2000 years to the birth of Christ. It is a purposeful break in the sequence of events and a re-start, but with additional information added via chapters 6 to 11.

Furthermore:

- Chapters 13 and 14 cover the Great Tribulation and the Second Coming of Christ.
 Chapter 6 also covers the same Great Tribulation and the Second Coming of Christ. (Refer Session 1)
 Thus 13 & 14 cover the same events but add more detail and from a different perspective.
- Also, chapter 16 covers the 'Wrath of God', and so does chapters 8 to 10. (and 11 in part)
- Finally, it seems that Rev 11:19b (+Rev 8:5b) and Rev 16:18-21 both cover the same event:

Compare the similarities between the verses in the table below:

Rev 11:19b (End of the 7 th Trumpet	Rev 16:18-21 (End of the 7 th Vial
Voices	Voices
Thunderings	Thunders
Lightnings	Lightnings
Earthquake	Earthquake
Great hail	Great hail


Both conclude with the same events.

It seems that Rev 11:19b and Rev 16:18-21 cover the same event, that is, the end of God's wrath and the commencement of God's reign on this earth.

Hence, we can therefore conclude that:

- Revelation 6-11 and Revelation 12-16 are parallel sequences covering the same topics.
- Revelation 12-16 confirms the events of Revelation 6-11 but contains additional information as well.
- Rev 11:19b and Rev 16:18-21 conclude with the same 'the end' event, and as a consequence:
- The end of the 7th Trumpet and the end of the 7th vial are somehow linked.
